






**CICOPA** represents around 68 000 cooperatives in industry and services around the world

### 95% of them are SMEs






#### Main types of cooperatives in CICOPA:

**Cooperatives are based on** standards (one definition, 7 operational principles and 10 underlying values) enshrined in the Statement on the Cooperative Identity (1995), reproduced in full in ILO Promotion of Cooperatives Recommendation, 2002 (n° 193)



# CICOPA has established complementary standards for:

- Worker cooperatives (2004)
- Social cooperatives (2011)



# National cooperative legislation


- is mainly aimed at :
- regulating those cooperative standards
- creating promotion policies for the entrepreneurial development of cooperatives



National <u>social economy</u> legislation is mainly aimed at providing a wider legal and promotional framework to cooperatives, mutuals, associations, foundations, « social enterprises » etc.









### The Greek social and solidarity economy law mixes those different levels

The risk is that it may not be effective in regulating and promoting social and solidarity economy enterprises and jobs



## The Greek social and solidarity economy law creates an artificial division between:

- Mutual cooperatives
- General interest cooperatives



- Is not in abidance with ILO R193
- Is not conducive to developing cooperatives nor the social economy












### CHNC worker cooperative in Quebec: a radio bought out by its workers in 2005
